HANDS-ON LEARNING

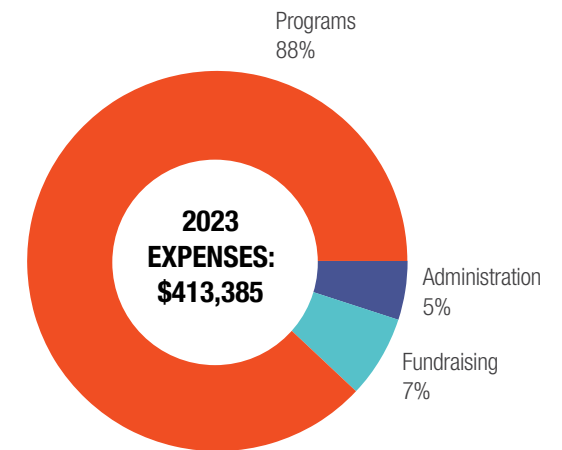
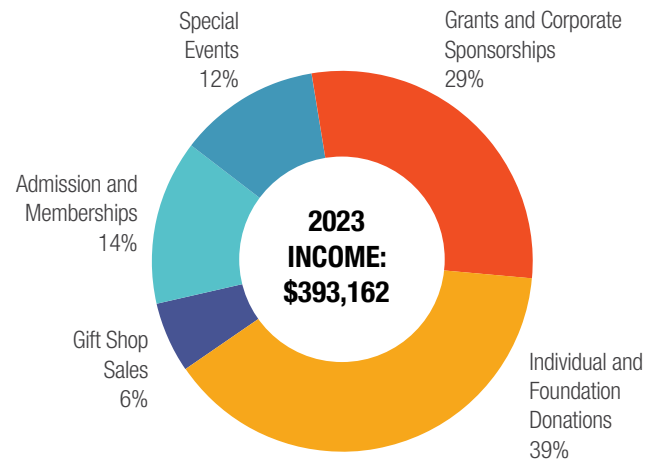
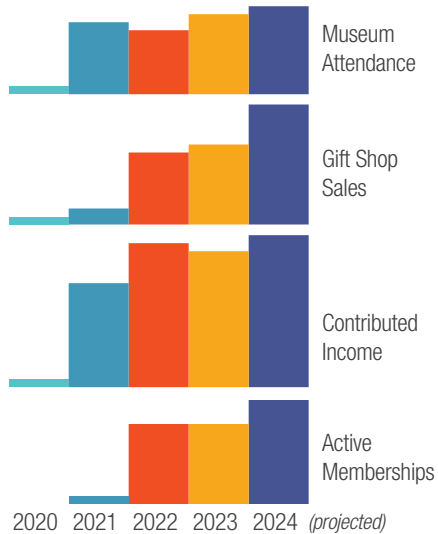
School groups flocked to the museum for scavenger hunts, robot demonstrations, and the opportunity to interact with authentic historical objects. "This place is awesome!"
